About Wushu

Wushu is a modern sport with deep traditional roots.

It has gained growing international recognition, featured at the World Games and the Asian Games, and will debut as an official medal sport at the Dakar 2026 Youth Olympic Games.

It has two main disciplines:

- **Taolu** – choreographed routines demonstrating speed, balance, and precision, performed with or without traditional weapons.
- **Sanda** – full-contact combat combining punches, kicks, and throws.

Both disciplines are internationally recognized for their athleticism, artistry, and intensity.

Why Support Matters

Competing in Brasilia requires significant resources for travel, accommodation, training, uniforms, and equipment. As wushu is still a non-professional sport in Belgium, our athletes depend on the generosity of sponsors and supporters to seize this opportunity.

At the same time, wushu is gaining worldwide recognition: in addition to the World Games, it will make its debut at the Youth Olympic Games.
